## Questions

Protocol. They are changing the name, changing the theme of the idea. They're in process of coming up with brochure, printing it out, and having more information. As soon as we have that, we will give it out to RAs to hand out to their residents.
Michelle M. (point of information): Medical Amnesty Program (MAP) is an initiative of the Office of Student Conduct. Doing it to encourage students to not only report their friends, but themselves, when medical attention is needed, when they overused some time of substance (alcohol is main thing). Many times, students are too drunk and are unresponsive, but are afraid to call RA for help.

MAP protocol - if they "map" you, you won't have to go through the Office of Student Conduct. You will have to meet with pro staff and go through some sort of educational session. You can be MAPed once in a two-year span, but can map other students unlimited times.

Jamshed: The person who maps others, they will not get in trouble?
Michelle: No.
Sophia (point of information): If there is some other policy violation, that will be taken care of. Remember, the main concern here is to make sure the person is okay, so I recommend that you call anyway. It is better to safe than sorry - you do not want your friend to die.

Rachel (point of information): A good way to remember it: MAP is for the person who needs. Another way to think of it is "Medical Attention Please"
