 - ii. Last year was \$21,000
 - 1. Main reason for increase is for increase in enrollment

Rebecca: Where will the extra money come from?

Winnie: Will have to work on budget and see which groups did not use their funds and figure out what we will use to cover

Diane: There are a lot of people/organizations who do not use their funding.

Anthony: When going over specific budgets, for certain things there are question marks.

Winnie: In the past, many vendors pulled back or changed things according to their agreement. Elaine found it difficult to constantly adjust budget to match state of Welcome Week, so now there are question marks. This leaves leeway.

 - i. They didn't know our line item was \$1500. Felipe told them it was \$1000, instead of actually \$1500, so they changed it to \$1500 after I clarified.
 - b. All money would be for getting food; none for marketing/programming
 - i. Just directly buying food with organizations partnering with them.

Questions:

Andy: (in regards to Jake Henry) I don't know what exactly to do to show support as a council. We can collect data from council ourselves and implement within council, not sure what exactly to do to push this within Sixth College. Anyone has idea right off the bat?

Anthony: To support, we can make it more well-known. When we're out doing something, make sure we're informing.

Andy: We can start a passive campaign. Posters posted around campus, in Commuter Lounge, in the Hub

Diane: He's working with OPHD (Office for Prevention of Harassment and Discrimination) to investigate sex assault /harrassment. We currently have sex harassment discrimination policies consistent for all UCs. What is he trying to educate on? Resources? Preventive programs? We might have available basic data, i.e. gender, but I don't know if there will be data of affinity groups, i.e. Greek life. Suggestion: just be clear on what you're supporting and what you're educating and what your goal is.

Rachel: What is he trying to do exactly? Will this be an event, or is he collecting information and posting about it?

Myra: What he said is that he is not trying to go back and collect past reports. Next school year, he wants to implement a system and work with that data that they can get from that system.

Diane: Will he receive reports and have them funneled to OPHD, or is he trying to work them to get their data?

Rachel: Adding on, is he trying to make OPHD more efficient?

Felipe: Trying to make it more transparent.

Diane: It's not that they are not transparent, but Title IX Office is using same mandated way to approach sexual assault/harassment cases. Is he trying to create an educational campaign for prevention or is he showing UCSD/national data?

Audrey: He has a Facebook post that has more information. Is it that he has an issue with how off-campus incidents within Greek Life gets reported?

Myra: Not sure about that.

Diane: Kind of answer, but not really. Something that happens on campus is reported to Title IX Office, or if it happens off-campus--depending on what nature of incident is--the Conduct Office can work with Student Affairs Office and OPHD to get jurisdiction. Just because it happened off-campus doesn't mean it may not be handled. Or if a student org hosts off-campus, same on-campus rules apply.

Rachel: Isn't data from student organizations already going to OPHD? I don't understand what data he is trying to collect.

Diane: I agree; that is what I am trying to get you to think about. Is it an awareness campaign, i.e. comparing UCSD's statistics to California/national stats? Consider inviting him in; especially if this is something you want to get behind.

Michelle M: I found his FB post. It explains everything we are talking about in detail. What it seems like he wants is to pressure Greek Life to release sexual assault statistics for frats/srats. He is working with an organization called No Longer Silent.

Diane: How would they get information out?

M: That I don't know.

Daniel H.: I don't think he's asking us to give data, but it seems more like having us be accountable to have students report that data and to make it known on campus so people can know about it.

Andy: Good discussion. Obviously we need a bit more info. I recommend going on his FB page to get more info. Can talk about this next week. I will invite him in to talk to us after Myra shares with me his contact email

Fae: Diversity advocates (me and Katya) have been brainstorming on coming year. We are thinking of creating/releasing an anonymous survey to Sixth College student community to get a feel for what identities they feel are being underrepresented in events/clubs, so we can help remedy that or at least create an event to point them an direction to organization that would help them address that.
